## Welcome Message from Principal:

We are now half way into Week 6, all students have been hard at work in classrooms . It has been fantastic to see students putting in 100% effort. Assessment is already occurring at this time in some subject areas, at the same time as important teaching and learning opportunities. Please ensure your child is attending school every day, unless of course, they are unwell.

Our children were so brilliantly behaved on the Maraka float on Saturday. We were so very proud that so much of the float was made by the children, ensuring they felt a part of the experience even if they were unable to be on the float. Thank you so much to the parents who made sure that they were there to pick up their child as soon as the procession finished. It was hugely appreciated. We were very proud of our Maraka Princess entrant as well.

Congratulations to all the swimmers who put in a huge effort on Thursday. The final event will be completed in swimming lessons and the overall results will be announced at assembly on Monday. On Friday our Token Reward Day was a big success, the children really enjoyed all aspects of the session. All our students need to remember however, that we are really only at the middle of the term and they still have a great deal of work to complete. They must be aware that their behaviour can impact hugely on the learning opportunities of others for the rest of the term. I am really looking forward to seeing our pre-prep students tomorrow and being able to have some early interviews with parents, to establish a really good understanding of each child before they commence Prep next year.

At this time of year, we are looking at what will be vital to set up for the next year. If you know of anyone yet to enrol their children, please advise them to come up and see the team in the Office as soon as possible. Similarly, if you are aware that your children will no longer be attending this school in 2025, please advise us, as this also has an impact on our planning. Once we have the enrolments for the next year, we are able to work through numbers of classes and which classrooms will be best for each class.

I am so excited that on the 26<sup>th</sup> of November, we are having our Music concert, where the Instrumental Music and Choir students showcase their talents, and demonstrate the year of hard work they have put into learning their instrument. It is such a commitment for our students who take on this very special opportunity. Learning to play a musical instrument is great for developing the brain. Research shows that when children learn to play music, their brain begins to hear and process sounds that they otherwise couldn't hear. This can aid in literacy development and therefore improved academic results.

## School Drop Off and Pick Up

It is important that our school remains safe and maintains hygienic environments for all of our community. Parents are asked to respect and adhere to the following measures:

- Students who are unwell must stay home.
- ❖ Parents are to use **MP Hall** area or **STOP**, **DROP & GO** area to drop students off in the morning. There will be supervision from 8.00am. Please do not congregate in/around school grounds to limit transfer of illnesses.
- ❖ Students can be collected from the **STOP, DROP & GO** area or **BACK GATE** area. Prep students will wait in the MP Hall each afternoon with their teachers.
- Please organise with your students where pick up will be. If situations change, please contact the office prior to 2:15pm to get a message to your child's classroom. Messages after 2.30pm may not be delivered in time.

## Student Absences

If your child is absent from school, please advise via the following methods:

Please ensure you include your CHILD'S NAME/ CLASS/ DATE/ and the <u>REASON FOR THE ABSENCE</u>. If no reason is provided, the absence will be recorded as "Unexplained". If your child is absent for 3 or more days without reason, you will be contacted by the office.

#### LATE ARRIVALS

All students arriving late (after 8:40am) to School MUST present to the Office and collect a Late Arrival Slip before going to class. Please try to have your students on time for school.

#### **EARLY DEPARTURES**

If you are collecting your child from school early, you MUST attend the Office and sign the Early Departure Register. Your child will then be asked to meet you at the Office. If possible, please advise your child's teacher and the Office beforehand, **especially when children are being collected at lunch times.** 

### **IMPORTANT**

If you are arranging for someone other than yourself to pick up your child from School, **ONLY** people you have listed as an **EMERGENCY CONTACT** may do so. Please visit the Office to complete the relevant paperwork to update your child's record. Changes to emergency contacts must be done in person – we cannot take this information over the phone.

#### GUIDELINES FOR PARENT ATTENDANCE

- ❖ Parents are welcome on the school grounds, however, it is difficult to have parents in classrooms before school. If you wish to participate in class volunteering please present to the office to make arrangements and sign in as a visitor.


