School Drop Off and Pick Up

It is important that our school remains safe and maintains hygienic environments for all of our community. Parents are asked to respect and adhere to the following measures:

- **Students and staff who are unwell must stay home.**
- Adults must not congregate in and around school grounds, car parks, school gates and outside classrooms.
- ❖ Parents are to use **MP Hall** area or **STOP**, **DROP** & **GO** area to drop students off in the morning. There will be supervision from 8.00am.
- ❖ Students can be picked up from the **STOP, DROP & GO** area or **BACK GATE** area.

 Please organise with your child/ren where pick up will be. Prep students will wait in the MP Hall each afternoon with their teachers.

LATE ARRIVALS -

All students arriving late to School MUST present to the Office and collect a Late Arrival Slip before going to class. Please try to have your students on time for school.

EARLY DEPARTURES -

If you are collecting your child from school early, you MUST attend the Office and sign the Early Departure Register. Your child will then be asked to meet you at the Office. If possible, please advise your child's teacher or the Office beforehand. *This is especially so when children are being collected at lunch times*.

IMPORTANT –

If you are arranging for someone other than yourself to pick up your child from School, **ONLY** those people you have listed as an **EMERGENCY CONTACT** may do so. Please call into the office to complete the relevant paperwork.

GUIDELINES FOR PARENT ATTENDANCE -

- * Remember to observe social distancing requirements. (1.5 metres for adults)
- ❖ Please observe COVID safe practices while on the school grounds.
- Maintaining good hand hygiene
- Staying home when sick
- ❖ Parents are allowed on the school grounds. Unfortunately, it is difficult to have parents in the classrooms due to social distancing. Mornings and afternoons are also very busy times for teachers. 

Today is the last day of Tuckshop for this year. Thank you very much for your support this year.


Tuckshop will reopen on Wednesday 24th January 2024.

STEAM Team 2023

The dedicated STEAM Team have enjoyed a brilliant 2023! We welcomed our new members from Year 4 early in the year and they quickly found their feet and began contributing well. The Year 5 students already knew the ropes and our Year 6 students expertly mentored and supported all the younger students.



We had our usual robotic and iPad fun throughout the year, and we were treated to a brand new set of 20 Sphero Bolts in a flash charging case! These are ball shaped robotic devices that can be programmed and have an LED screen. They are incredibly fast and robust. We may have got a little rowdy when it was Sphero Chasey time!

At the beginning of Term 2, our school was successful in winning a grant of \$10,370 from Sustainability Funding for a project titled 'Native Trees for Native Bees and Other Wildlife'. Our weekly lessons changed to doing lots of research around native bees and suitable plants and nesting boxes/hives. We learnt a lot! We discovered that we had several native bee hives already in our school grounds! We had concerns about dry weather and security of nesting boxes and hives over school holidays and luckily, we got an extension on our project to mid-2024.

So, STEAM Team of 2024 will have a busy Term 1 and 2 completing this exciting environmental project!

It is with a little sadness, but also huge pride that I farewell our Year 6 STEAM Teamers who have been with me for 3 years – Luciana, Heath, Laura, Adele, Tilly, Ruby. Plus, Ada, Kurt and Judah who joined us for the second half of the year as an alternative to Green STEM. I wish you a bright future in the world of STEM!




