Welcome Message from Principal:

This term has already been incredibly busy, and with the weather so unpredictable, changes to events are constantly being made. Our drama visitor presented exciting programs, with all classes and teachers very involved. Teachers observed what knowledge and skills individual students were exhibiting and are deciding what impact this has on planning and assessment.

Unpredictable weather conditions had meant that Cross Country was postponed from Term 1, 2024, and subsequently had to fit around the week long drama program as it had been arranged during Term 4, 2023. The children participating had a brilliant time throughout the day, and I was really sad that in the afternoon due to other circumstances I missed the races. All of the students put in a great effort and showed such commitment to completing the course no matter what.

District Cross Country is taking place tomorrow, which unfortunately had a short turn around for permission forms, due to Monday's public holiday and our own Cross Country on Friday last week. I know that this has been complex for other schools as well.

We have cancelled our school disco again, as the Student Council were concerned for students attending HR Cross Country and NQ State Futsal that they would be too tired to attend and felt that they shouldn't miss out. Some very energetic and thoughtful discussion took place. We have a spectacular School Council who understand they are the <u>'voice' of all students</u>, and that it is important they bring ideas and concerns from students across all year levels. I am absolutely loving working with them, and the more experience they get, the better they will get at communication.

It has been fantastic to see the number of students who are borrowing books and enjoy reading in their spare moments. However, there are also quite a few students mention that they do not like reading and prefer to play games on iPads and Tablets at home. Please try to encourage your child to read books, and keep their screen and game time down. One of my favourite quotes from Dr Seuss is, "You're never too old, too wacky or too wild to pick up a book and read to a child."

Reading books aloud to children stimulates their imagination and expands their understanding of the world. It helps to develop language and listening skills, and prepares them to understand the written word. We have a brilliant library here at the school but always remember our wonderful town library, it has so many wonderful features and the people working at the library are always so happy to help you with books for yourself (always good for your child to see you reading) or your child.

Many of our students and teachers have been quite ill this term, please remind your child to cough into their elbow, use tissues and wash their hands often. We want our students at school every day but if your child is not well, please don't send them to school.

Also, please remember to check your children's hair for head lice and ensure that your child is treated immediately. It is not fair for others, if your child continually is infected and passes it to other children. If a child has head lice, they are usually very uncomfortable and cannot concentrate on their learning. Socially and emotionally, it is not good for your child either, as children will not want to play with them if they are scared that they will catch head lice from them.

School Drop Off and Pick Up

It is important that our school remains safe and maintains hygienic environments for all of our community. Parents are asked to respect and adhere to the following measures:

- **Students and staff who are unwell must stay home.**
- ❖ Adults must not congregate in and around school grounds, car parks, school gates and outside classrooms.
- ❖ Parents are to use **MP Hall** area or **STOP**, **DROP** & **GO** area to drop students off in the morning. There will be supervision from 8.00am.
- ❖ Students can be picked up from the **STOP, DROP & GO** area or **BACK GATE** area.

 Please organise with your child/ren where pick up will be. Prep students will wait in the MP Hall each afternoon with their teachers.

LATE ARRIVALS -

All students arriving late to School MUST present to the Office and collect a Late Arrival Slip before going to class. Please try to have your students on time for school.

EARLY DEPARTURES -

If you are collecting your child from school early, you MUST attend the Office and sign the Early Departure Register. Your child will then be asked to meet you at the Office. If possible, please advise your child's teacher or the Office beforehand. *This is especially so when children are being collected at lunch times*.

IMPORTANT -

If you are arranging for someone other than yourself to pick up your child from School, **ONLY** those people you have listed as an **EMERGENCY CONTACT** may do so. Please call into the office to complete the relevant paperwork.

GUIDELINES FOR PARENT ATTENDANCE -

- * Remember to observe social distancing requirements. (1.5 metres for adults)
- Please observe COVID safe practices while on the school grounds.





<u>Instrumental Music - Strings</u>

Please remind your child to bring their instruments to school each week for lessons. It is important that all instruments are tuned each week and checked regularly. Can I also ask that your child's fingernails are kept short and trimmed as long nails get caught in the strings and it is impossible to shape the fingers correctly. Thank you for your support with this.

Thank you to all families for encouraging regular home practice. I recommend 4-5 days of home practice of 10-15 minutes is best for primary children. Parents can help at home by watching and supervising their child playing their instruments. Each child will be given a home practice sheet to fill in when they practice and they can earn stickers and rewards for consistent work at home.

Year 3 beginner lesson books are now available from the school office for \$28. Year 3 lessons will continue this Friday.




